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National Youth Service In Zimbabwe




National Youth Services aims to provide practical skills training to empower youth and support economic development.

The Government of Zimbabwe is implementing the Heritage-Based Curriculum Framework for 2024 to 2030, which introduces a two-route pathway for secondary school learners: one for academic pursuits aimed at university progression, and the other for vocational skills acquisition. This framework requires Ordinary Level students to take five compulsory subjects, with an option for additional subjects, while Advanced Level students must choose three subjects based on their career pathway. The initiative aims to reduce subject overload, ensuring learners acquire relevant skills, values, and attitudes for life and work, particularly emphasizing a strong scientific and technological bias.

In line with this curriculum, the National Youth Service (NYS) can play a vital role by aligning its training programs with the vocational pathways established in the framework. The NYS can provide practical skills training in areas such as carpentry and technical education, complementing the government's focus on vocational skills. By doing so, the NYS can help bridge the gap between academic knowledge and practical skills, empowering youth to make informed choices about their futures while contributing to the economy based on Zimbabwe's natural endowments and heritage.
